

Privacy notice for parents/carers

Your child's school is part of the Multi Academy Trust called Nene Education Trust. The Trust is the organisation who are in charge of your personal information (or personal data). This means the Trust is called the Data Controller.

Under data protection law, individuals have a right to be informed about how the Trust and its schools uses any personal data that we hold about them. We comply with this right by providing 'privacy notices' to individuals where we are processing their personal data. This privacy notice explains how we collect, store and use personal data about parents/carers.

The personal data we hold

Personal data that we may collect, use, store and share (when appropriate) about you includes, but is not restricted to:

- Contact details and contact preferences (such as your name, address, email address and telephone numbers)
- > Bank details
- > Details of your family circumstances
- Details of any safeguarding information including court orders or professional involvement

- > Records of your correspondence and contact with us
- > Details of any complaints you have made

We may also collect, use, store and share (when appropriate) information about you that falls into "special categories" of more sensitive personal data. This includes, but is not restricted to, information about:

- Any health conditions you have that we need to be aware of
- > Photographs and CCTV images captured in school
- If a Faith school, your religion, as part of our admission arrangements if applicable

We may also hold data about you that we have received from other organisations, including other schools and social services.

Why we use this data

We use this data to:

- a) Report to you on your child's attainment and progress
- b) Keep you informed about the running of the school (such as emergency closures) and events
- c) Process payments for school services and clubs
- d) Provide appropriate pastoral care
- e) Administer admissions waiting lists
- f) Assess the quality of our services
- g) communicate details of events and opportunities for pupils provided in the wider community and / or the Parent Teacher Association (PTA) or equivalent of the school
- h) Carry out research
- i) Confirm your identity
- i) Confirm your child eligibility for a school place
- k) Comply with our legal and statutory obligations
- 1) Obtain relevant funding for the school
- m) Raise or address any concerns about safeguarding
- n) Supply government agencies including the police where required by law

Our lawful basis for using this data

The use of parent/carer information is lawful for the following reasons:

- We need to comply with a legal obligation
- We need it to perform an official task in the public interest
- We have obtained consent to use it in a certain way
- We need to protect the individual's vital interests (or someone else's interests)
- Where the processing is necessary in order to ensure your health & safety on the academy site, including making reasonable adjustments any disabilities you may have

Whilst the majority of processing of personal data we hold about you will not require your consent, we will inform you if your consent is required and seek that consent before any processing takes place.

Use of your personal information for marketing purposes

Where you have given us consent to do so, Nene Education Trust may send you marketing information by email or text promoting Trust events, campaigns, charitable causes or services that may be of interest to you. You can withdraw consent or 'opt out' of receiving these texts and/or emails at any time by clicking on the "Unsubscribe" link at the bottom of any such communication.

Our basis for using special category data

For 'special category' data, we only collect and use it when we have both a lawful basis, as set out above, and one of the following conditions for processing as set out in data protection law:

- > We have obtained your explicit consent to use your personal data in a certain way
- > We need to perform or exercise an obligation or right in relation to employment, social security or social protection law
- > We need to protect an individual's vital interests (i.e. protect your life or someone else's life), in situations where you're physically or legally incapable of giving consent
- >The data concerned has already been made manifestly public by you
- > We need to process it for the establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims
- > We need to process it for reasons of substantial public interest as defined in legislation
- > We need to process it for health or social care purposes, and the processing is done by, or under the direction of, a health or social work professional or by any other person obliged to confidentiality under law

- > We need to process it for public health reasons, and the processing is done by, or under the direction of, a health professional or by any other person obliged to confidentiality under law
- >We need to process it for archiving purposes, scientific or historical research purposes, or for statistical purposes, and the processing is in the public interest

For criminal offence data, we will only collect and use it when we have both a lawful basis, as set out above, and a condition for processing as set out in data protection law. Conditions include:

- > We have obtained your consent to use it in a specific way
- > We need to protect an individual's vital interests (i.e. protect your life or someone else's life), in situations where you're physically or legally incapable of giving consent
- The data concerned has already been made manifestly public by you
- > We need to process it for, or in connection with, legal proceedings, to obtain legal advice, or for the establishment, exercise or defence of legal rights
- > We need to process it for reasons of substantial public interest as defined in legislation

Collecting this information

While the majority of information we collect about parents/carers is mandatory, there is some information that can be provided voluntarily.

Whenever we seek to collect information from you or your child, we make it clear whether providing it is mandatory or optional. If it is mandatory, we will explain the possible consequences of not complying.

Most of the data we hold about you will come from you, but we may also hold data about you from:

- Local authorities
- ➤ Government departments or agencies
- > Your children
- > Police forces, courts, tribunals

How we store this data

We keep personal information about parents/carers while you child is attending a Trust school. We may also keep it beyond their attendance at our school if this is necessary in order to comply with our legal obligations. Our

Record Retention Policy sets out how long we keep information about parents/carers.

We have put in place appropriate security measures to prevent your personal information being accidentally lost, used or accessed in an unauthorised way, altered or disclosed.

We will dispose of your personal data securely when we no longer need it.

Data sharing

We do not share information about parents/carers with any third party without consent unless the law and our policies allow us to do so.

Where it is legally required or necessary (and it complies with data protection law) we may share personal information about you:

- Our local authority to meet our legal obligations to share certain information
- with it, such as safeguarding concerns
- The Department for Education
- Educators and examining bodies
- Our regulator Ofsted,
- Suppliers and service providers to enable them to provide the service we have contracted them for
- Financial organisations
- Central and local government
- Our auditors
- Survey and research organisations
- Health authorities
- Security organisations
- Health and social welfare organisations
- Professional advisers and consultants
- Charities and voluntary organisations
- Police forces, courts, tribunals
- Professional bodies

Transferring data internationally

Where we transfer personal data to a country or territory outside the European Economic Area, we will do so in accordance with data protection law.

Parents/carers rights regarding personal data

Individuals have a right to make a 'subject access request' to gain access to personal information that the Trust holds about them.

If you make a subject access request, and if we do hold information about you, we will (subject to any exemptions that may apply):

- >Give you a description of it
- >Tell you why we are holding and processing it, and how long we will keep it for
- > Explain where we got it from, if not from you
- >Tell you who it has been, or will be, shared with
- Let you know whether any automated decision-making is being applied to the data, and any consequences of this
- > Give you a copy of the information in an intelligible form

You may also have the right for your personal information to be transmitted electronically to another organisation in certain circumstances.

Other rights regarding your data

Under data protection law, individuals have certain rights regarding how their personal data is used and kept safe, including the right to:

- Object to the use of personal data if it would cause, or is causing, damage or distress
- Prevent your data being used to send direct marketing
- Object to decisions being taken by automated means (by a computer or machine, rather than by a person)
- In certain circumstances, have inaccurate personal data corrected, deleted or destroyed, or restrict processing
- In certain circumstances, be notified of a data breach
- Make a complaint to the Information Commissioner's Office
- Claim compensation for damages caused by a breach of the data protection regulations

Complaints

We take any complaints about our collection and use of personal information very seriously.

If you think that our collection or use of personal information is unfair, misleading or inappropriate, or have any other concern about our data processing, please raise this with us in the first instance.
